Mission Statement

Assistance in Healthcare (AIH) is a not-for-profit charity which offers financial support to cancer patients in active treatment who have become financially challenged. We help offset non-medical expenses such as food, utilities, and mortgage/rent during their cancer treatment.

Message from the *Founder*

Cheers All,

As the founder of Assistance in Healthcare (AIH), I’m pleased to have this opportunity to share a bit of history about this remarkable organization which has become a lifeline to thousands of cancer patients and their families since its creation in 1983.

The first night following my becoming chairman of a hospital in Zion, Illinois in 1975 that would ultimately become the flagship of Cancer Treatment Centers of America® (CTCA), I walked the halls and talked with every patient I could find. Those who know me well would not find this the least bit strange or out of character, as any patient with whom I can connect directly is well worth the effort to do so in my book. It is in fact why we do what we do... as it is *always and only about the patient.*

I did this walkabout repeatedly for many nights, weeks and months thereafter. We already knew how physically and emotionally devastating a cancer diagnosis and potentially lengthy battle with the disease could be for patients and their families. We also came to know, through my family’s and my own painful experience with my mother’s courageous battle with bladder cancer, that treatment of the whole person – body, mind and soul – was non-existent at that time. In fact, following my mother’s passing several years later, we committed in her memory to changing that paradigm, to changing the face of cancer care and thus, Cancer Treatment Centers of America was born.

But it was those late night walks through the patient corridors in Zion where I learned firsthand from patients about a different, though no less debilitating, aspect of their cancer fight. Like cancer, it is also one that can negatively impact a person’s whole life and family. I heard from these patients about their many financial burdens above and beyond the medical costs of a cancer diagnosis. For far too many families, daily living expenses such as food, utilities, housing and other basic needs, can be overwhelming, especially when treatments require significant time away from home and work. And while efforts were already underway in Zion to help ease the burden of rising medical costs, to my knowledge there was not a single program anywhere in America to help patients focus solely on fighting their cancer without the added worry of mounting non-medical bills. That had to change.

In 1983, we established and launched Assistance in Healthcare, a non-profit 501(c)3 charitable organization dedicated to patient care “beyond the medicine.” Today, under the gifted and



exemplary leadership of its chairperson, Jamie Stephenson, AIH has chapters at all five CTCA hospitals, supporting patients in Zion (formed in 1983); Tulsa, Oklahoma (formed in 1993); Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (formed in 2006); Goodyear, Arizona (formed in 2008); and Newnan, Georgia (formed in 2012). Donations to AIH chapters, which receive no state or federal funding, have provided financial support for the non-medical expenses of thousands of CTCA and other cancer patients throughout the country. Thanks to the compassion and generosity of donors nationwide, Assistance in Healthcare has enabled cancer patients to keep their lights on and get the groceries, transportation and housing support they need to stay focused on their healing journeys.

I owe a debt of gratitude to those patients in the hallways of Zion who allowed me to interrupt their quiet and were courageous enough to share their most personal stories of pain and survival. It is because of you that Assistance in Healthcare was born and continues to touch so many lives, for which I am forever grateful...and so are they.

Message from the *Chairperson*

*Dear Friends of
Assistance in Healthcare,*

Assistance in Healthcare (AIH) has made a very real difference in countless lives since its inception in 1983. I had the privilege of being invited in 2001 to serve on the AIH board in Zion, where I have worked with an amazing team of volunteers committed to helping people who are struggling to pay their everyday bills while undergoing treatment. When I took on the national chairmanship role four years ago, I vowed to do everything in my power to help this wonderful organization get to a place where nobody in need of assistance with personal expenses, while they faced the challenge of a cancer diagnosis, was ever turned away. I am proud to say, on behalf of a wonderful team of fundraisers, philanthropists and just plain compassionate and caring individuals, we are moving quickly in that direction.

My first and probably most impactful experience with cancer occurred when I was a teenager. My Uncle Freddy died of cancer when he was only 37 years old. I will never forget the impact it had on my mom and our whole family. He left behind a young wife, a nine-year-old son and daughter who had just turned four. While not as difficult financially for them as many, the loss and struggles to regain wholeness as a family were devastating.

When you look at the toll cancer takes on a family, what is often less obvious is the personal financial burden, above and beyond the medical and insurance costs. The day-to-day life expenses of mortgage or rent, electricity, groceries, schooling, etc. become pressures that are often insurmountable when a cancer diagnosis suddenly interferes with a patient or caregiver’s ability to support a family. I could not imagine today, as a mom, being forced to choose between paying bills and putting food on the table for my son or using those funds to keep myself or a loved one in treatment. Yet, that is the plight of far too many cancer patients.

My father-in-law, Richard J Stephenson, refers to our family’s relationship with Cancer Treatment Centers of America® as a calling, not a business. I too feel very much the same way about Assistance in Healthcare. I am extremely blessed, and could not be prouder or more humbled, to serve as the national chair of this wonderful organization.



To the patients, families and caregivers who should never have to make a choice between treatment and providing basic necessities for their families, you have my commitment to helping change that reality once and for all.

And to the compassionate and dedicated people around me who embrace this mission, thank you for your support, thank you for your caring, and thank you for your commitment to making the world a better place for those who must focus their energies on a personal healing journey.

Assistance in Healthcare reviewed 3,632 applications for fiscal year 2017 and granted \$910,718 to patients and families in need.

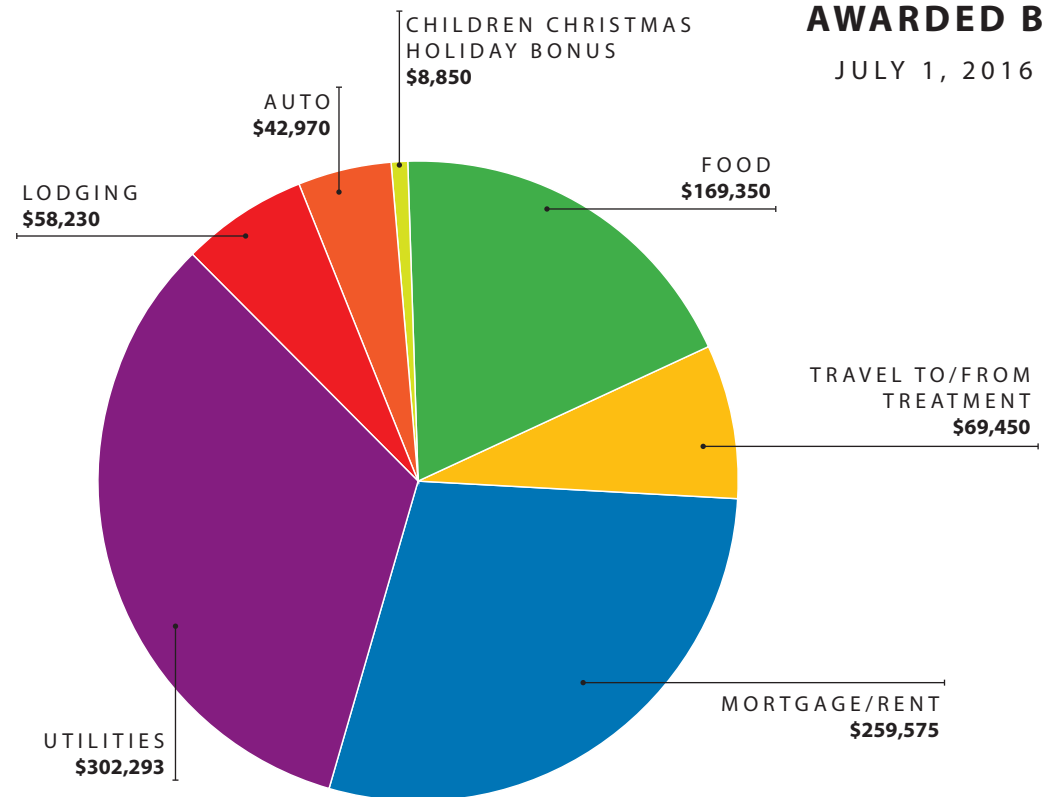

Who We *Help* and Why

For a patient who receives a diagnosis of cancer, the financial impact can be significant. **In 2017 there will be an estimated 1,685,210 new cancer diagnoses.**

We help lessen the burden of non-medical needs such as groceries, utilities, housing, transportation and basic living expenses which may be neglected during cancer treatment.

When cancer invades a family's way of life and interferes with their ability to earn a living and support their family, the resulting financial burden, beyond the medical costs, can be devastating. Far too many cancer patients, families and caregivers, already battling to make ends meet, find themselves in the horribly stressful position of choosing between paying the rent or mortgage, keeping the lights on, feeding their families or affording their out-of-pocket treatment expenses.



AIH does not receive federal funding. We rely solely on the generosity of our supporters through foundations, corporations, and private individuals.

AIH is managed by an all-volunteer group.
